Dear Sir,

It is my privilege to submit to you in accordance with Section 11 of the Primary Products Marketing Act 1953, the seventh annual report of the New Zealand Honey Marketing Authority. This report is in respect of the financial year ended 31st August, 1960.

#### Members of the Authority:

No election was held during the year ended August 31st, 1960, when membership of the Authority remained unaltered. Members of the Authority at this date were Mr. W. W. Nelson (Chairman), Messrs. W. T. Herron, G. E. Gumbrell, W. B. Bray, J. W. Fraser and Mr. K. B. Longmore (Government Representative).

Since the end of the financial year a further election took place and a considerable change was made in the membership of the Authority. Owing to ill-health, Mr. W. B. Bray did not seek re-election and by mutual agreement the National Beekeepers' Association relinquished its direct representation. At this election held in September 1960, the Chairman, Mr. W. W. Nelson, was defeated at the polls and Messrs. J. R. Barber and J. W. Fraser were duly elected as producer representatives.

#### Appointment of New Manager:

During the year Mr. W. H. Chudley, who had been Manager of the Authority since its inception, intimated his intention to retire at the end of October 1960. The position was advertised on a Dominion wide basis and an appreciable number of applications were received. Mr. C. T. Gosse was appointed to the position and commenced his duties just prior to the end of the financial year.

#### Conditions of Supply:

As the contract system had proved unsatisfactory both to the Authority and to suppliers, it was decided not to pursue this form of supply for 1960, but to invite supplies of graded lines to be paid for on a pro-rata basis, Manuka and Birch to be purchased as previously.

#### Honey Supplied to Authority :

Another season of light crops was experienced but the intake of honey to the Authority showed a substantial increase on the previous year. The annual receipts from suppliers since 1953 are as follows:—

#### Marketing:

Unfortunately the amount of white clover honey received was barely enough to supply our needs for the local market and only a token quantity of this grade could be forwarded to our London Agent. This was unfortunate as unprecedented prices were ruling for premium honeys. In addition to "Imperial Bee" the Authority decided to pack a light amber honey for the local market and thus secure better realisations for suppliers. After initial difficulties this pack can now be claimed to be selling satisfactorily and is becoming a stabilising influence on the local market.

The sales of honey to Australia, Kenya and the East are increasing in volume and a worthwhile trade is being developed.

"Honeyco" and Birch continue to enjoy a steady sale overseas at prices which compared to world parity must be considered satisfactory.

Manuka honey continues to be a problem.

During the year 344 tons of honey were sold in the United Kingdom and Europe and 34 tons in other overseast

On the local market 322 tons of honey were sold, comprising 177 tons in retail packs and 145 tons in bulk.

#### Honey Levy

The revenue from levy on honey sold by beekeepers increased slightly. Following are the comparative figures for the last seven years :-

#### Depots :

No change was made in existing arrangements. Depots are established at Auckland, New Plymouth, Greymouth, Christchurch, Timaru, Dunedin and Invercargill.

#### Payments to Suppliers:

With the abolition of the contract premium the advance to suppliers for graded honey was increased to 10d. per lb. pro-rata. The advance on Birch and Manuka remained the same at 7d and 6d respectively. The final payment for graded honeys was 41/2d per 1b pro-rata with 4d per 1b for birch and 3d per 1b. for manuka.

The following table shows the payments for graded honey other than manuka, birch and special lines since the Authority was established in 1953.

#### Finance:

During the year the Stock Debt of £71,187 owing to the Department of Agriculture was discharged and was replaced by an overdraft limit at 1% with the Reserve Bank. Final payments to suppliers accounted for all but £611 of the surplus which was transferred to the Accumulated Fund. The Stock Fluctuation Fund remains unaltered.

#### Honey Marketing Investigation Committee.

The findings of this special Committee have been most helpful and a number of recommendations made have already been put into practice.
