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NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

The Hon. Minister of Agriculture, Parliament Buildings, Wellington.

Dear Sir,

In accordance with Section 11 of the Primary Products Marketing Act 1953 $\rm am$ -submitting to you the Annual Report of the N.Z. Honey Marketing Authority for the year ended August 31st, 1972.

Personnel of Authority:

Messrs H. Cloake and R. F. Poole retired by rotation and Mr Cloake did not seek reelection. The election resulted in Mr B. Forsyth of Ohaupo being elected and Mr R. F. Poole of Alexandra being re-elected. The unsuccessful candidates were Mr P. Berry of Havelock North and Mr J. Davies of Drummond.

Conditions of Supply:

Due to the improvement in finances it was not necessary this year to pay the advance payments for honey by instalments. The advance payment was set at 2 cents per pound ahead of the previous year and this was subsequently increased by a further 2 cents when returns from sales showed a welcome upward trend. Due to leakage from containers of liquid honey it was necessary to reinstate the requirement that starter be added to honey supplied in export containers.

Production and Intake:

Honey production throughout the country was similar to the previous 2 or 3 years, and the Authority's intake reflected this with an intake of 1814 tons. The quantity sold on the local market again declined, but overseas sales at very good prices resulted in a better net return than local sales would have given.

Payout:

Because of high export prices the Authority made the highest payout in it's history, namely 18.5 cents per pound pro rata. This gave producers an increase of from 4 to 4.9 cents per pound according to grade.

Marketing:

Because of high overseas prices referred to above, and because of increases in costs, the Authority increased it's wholesale prices on the N.Z. market by 5 cents per pound. This was questioned by the Price Tribunal under the Prices Stabilization Regulations and the Authority was instructed to reduce it's prices by 3 cents per pound.

As overseas prices have continued to rise we will be making further efforts to bring local prices more in line with world prices.

Reserves:

We have set aside the final \$10,000 for the purchase of Hornby Branch, \$10,000 has been put into Plant Development Reserve and a further \$5,806 has been written off Intangible Assets. In addition, Accumulated Funds have been increased by \$7,675.


