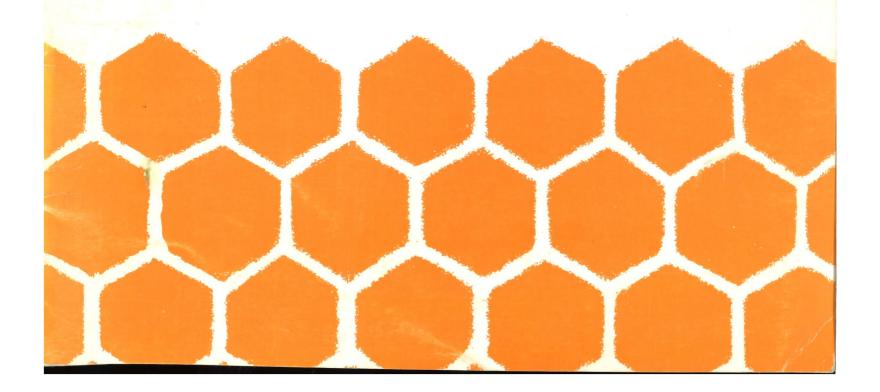

22ND ANNUAL REPORT AND STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

The Hon. Minister of Agriculture & Fisheries, Parliament Buildings, Wellington.

Dear Sir,

In accordance with Section 11 of the Primary Products Marketing Act, 1953, I am submitting to you the Annual Report of the N.Z. Honey Marketing Authority for the year ended 31st August, 1975.

Personnel of the Authority.

As there was no election in the last twelve months, the membership of the Authority is unchanged from that of last year.

Conditions of Supply

The advance payable on honey graded for export remained at 40c per kg. and the freight allowance was also the same as last year. The early delivery bonus was varied to allow for a later production season in the lower half of the South Island, and it may be necessary to discontinue the bonus forwater white honey as buyers were no longer paying a premium price for this grade.

Production and Intake

The production of honey throughout New Zealand was higher than for many years with the result that the intake into the Authority was a record 2914 tonnes. This was 669 tonnes higher than the previous best year of 1971, when the intake was 2245 tonnes.

Payout

In accordance with your directive, the Authority announced early in 1975 that the payout would be a minimum of 54c, with a maximum—subject to trading results, of 57c. Unfortunately, due to a fall off in overseas demand and prices, sales were very slow, and only improved after the August currency devaluation. The result is that in order to pay 54c per kg. it was necessary to draw over \$90,000 from reserves. The actual payout was 55.74c per kg for honey grading 100 points.

Marketing

As mentioned above, overseas sales only picked up after currency devaluation, and as this happened within a few days of the end of the financial year, the full effects do not show in this year's accounts. The Authority priced its packed lines on the home market at a figure to recover the base price, but as many producers chose to supply the same market with their increased production at a lower price than the Authority's, our sales decreased in volume. This ability of the private sector of the Industry to undercut prices is of special concern to the Authority as it hampers our attempts to promote orderly marketing.

Land and Buildings

The high intake proved to be too great for the covered storage at both Christchurch and Pleasant Point, with the result that a lot of honey was stored outside in 44 gallon drums. Although 5" x 2" tanalised timber was used as bearers for the drums, there was some ground subsidence due to the high winter rainfall. As a result, some rock fill and gravelling of the storage area was carried out. Normal maintenance has been carried out as required on plant and buildings.

Reserves

The Reserve accounts have been reduced by \$91,620. Being the amount|by which trading results fell short of the base payout of 54c per kg. average, plus the amounts of capital repayments on our Rural Bank mortgages.

Staff

During the year Mr. C.W. Carr was forced by ill health to resign and the Authority was sorry to lose his services. All staff carried an increased work load due to the record intake, and their efforts are greatly appreciated.

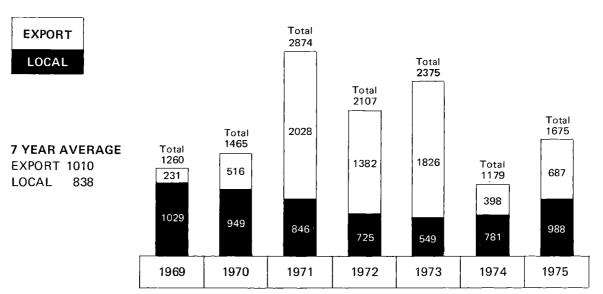

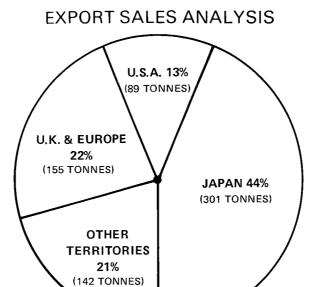

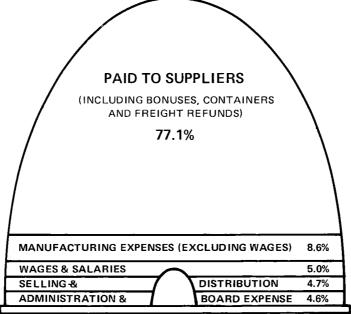

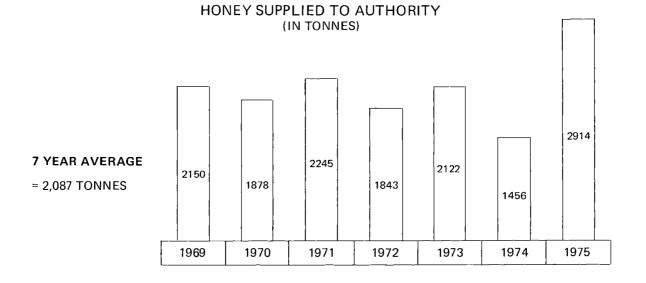
