The following is another account of be honey poisoning affair near Morrinsvile, by which five Maoris lost their lives. A. Maori said to be 100 years old, and er-tainly little, if any, short of that age, feling unwell, recently, told his friends lot to bother about him or to trouble thmselves by coming much to the whire, where he lived alone. He said he world find a grave for himself, which they understood to mean that he would probbly retire to one of the caves near there and die. Last Friday he was missed, and eght stalwart Maori men started to search for him. " Having been unable to find him hey retired in the evening to his where, and in their hunger regaled themselves tith honey from one of his hives. They lere soon taken very ill, and recognised hat they had eaten honey gathered by sees from poisonous tree blossoms. Five of them are dead, and the other three hve recovered after fearful sufferings. of them had his tongue badly mangled as a result of convulsions. A constable has been instructed to destroy the remaiter of the honey, except a sample for analyis The deceased Macris were intelligent, industrious, upright men, and pleasant neith bours. They were well known in Morrhs ville, where they often came with forhorse waggons, bringing flax or other produce. It is but a fortnight since a ig feast terminated which had been given by the Watanui natives for the opening & On that occasion a larg the public hall. number of Pakeha visitors were cordial entertained day after day. Now it is tangi. Cries of grief could yesterday b sometimes heard for half a mile.
