LONDON WHARF FIRE. NEW ZEALAND HONEY LOST. COVERED BY INSURANCE.

LONDON, July 8.

A fierce fire at Morton's wharf, Milwall, destroyed 60 tons of New Zealand honey. The whole building was quickly ablaze and the roof crashed in.

More than 300 firemen wearing gasmasks on firefloats and river barges fought the flames, confining them to the one building.

The honey destroyed was all covered by insurance. Arrangements have been made for new premises to enable orders to be fulfilled until fresh supplies arrive.
