Our new design on the 5 lb. standard decorated tin we consider, has outstanding eye appeal, the design being a most attractive one in four bright colours incorporating the word "Honey" in bold lettering in three panels on the body of the tin. These panels are so positioned that it is not necessary for the tin to be "centred" when placed on the retailer's shelf. We are confident that this new decoration, which appears on the front page of this pamphlet, will be very popular, both with the Honey Producer and with the ultimate consumer.

A further innovation has been introduced with regard to our 60 lb. screw top container. The opening is now  $3\frac{1}{4}$ " diameter and we feel sure that this increase in aperture will be welcomed by producers as it will facilitate can filling. The New Zealand Honey Marketing Authority has given its full approval to this added improvement as, of course, it is also more easily decanted. Our aims in the past have been to establish and maintain a high level of goodwill between the canister maker and the honey producer, and we feel that by introducing our attractive new decoration in the 5 lb. size and our new improved 60 lb. honey tin with  $3\frac{1}{4}$ in. screw cap, we are further maintaining this good relationship.
