THE BEES AND APPLIANCES (INTRODUCTION) REGULATIONS 1946

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of June, 1946

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Apiaries Act, 1927, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Bees and Appliances (Introduction) Regulations 1946.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1946.
 - 2. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,— "Appliance" means any hive, bee-comb, extractor, or other appliance that has been used in connection with bee-keeping.
- 3. (1) The regulations made under the Apiaries Amendment Act, 1913, on the 26th day of May, 1924, and published in the *Gazette* on the 5th day of June, 1924, at page 1374, and enuring under the Apiaries Act, 1927, are revoked.
- (2) All consents, and generally all acts of authority which originated under the regulations hereby revoked and are of continuing effect at the time of coming into force of these regulations, shall enure for the purposes of these regulations as if they had originated under these regulations, and shall, where necessary, be deemed to have so originated.
- 4. The introduction into New Zealand of bees or of any appliance is prohibited.

- 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of the last preceding regulation, it shall be lawful for any person with the prior consent in writing of the Minister of Agriculture, and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed in such consent, to introduce bees into New Zealand from any country or place specified in such consent, together with such appliances as are necessary to serve as containers for bees so introduced.
- 6. Every application for consent to introduce bees into New Zealand shall be in writing signed by the applicant, and shall state the name and address of the breeder and the keeper of the bees and the location of the apiary from which the applicant proposes to obtain such bees.
