On 18.4.50 four queen bees despatched from Speara Apiaries, Hamburg, Laranie, U.S.A., to J.H.Lowe, P.O.Box 165, Tauranga, were received at Wallaceville. Examination of attendant bees showed them free from Acarine disease, but one attendant bee in each of two cages was infected with Nosema apis.

Because these bees had been imported without authority this end, and were not accompanied by a satisfactory certificate certifying them free from disease, they were destroyed.
