Your letter addressed to Mr. T. Palmer-Jonos, Animal Research Station, Wallaceville, regarding the importation of queen bees from Australia has been referred to the Director, Horticulture Division, for stantion.

Any application for the necessary authority to import bees should be made to this office in the first place, stating the variety (race) and the number of queen bees it is proposed to import, also the mame and address of the breader of the bees. Any authority to import bees issued by this Department would be subject to a successful application for an import license from the Comptrollor of Customs, Wellington.

Where authority is granted to import bees certain conditions must be complied with. A copy of the conditions is supplied with each authority issued, for despatch to the vendor by the buyer in New Zealand. (Gopy attached for your information). The precentions taken under the Apiaries Regulations, 1943, are to prevent the possible introduction of bee diseases into New Zealand.

There is no evidence that the Italian bees raised on Kangaroo Island, South Australia, are as good as the best strains of Italian bees raised in New Zealand. I would therefore advise you to procure a breading queen from any reliable queen-breader in New Zealand.
